2014 National Conference

- * Piloted integrated conference model with National in Ottawa (June 2014)
- * 544 delegates sent satisfaction survey (45 per cent response rate)
- * Over 85 per cent respondents were satisfied/very satisfied with the relevance, quality and variety of offerings

- November 2014: Task and Solutions Professional Services (TSPS) Procurement Tool for Evaluation Services Speakers (46)
- * Holiday Networking Event (30)

Accomplishments: Professional Development

- * January (14), May (9), and September (19)
- * May 2014 session was dedicated to piloting of updated ESS
- 93% of ESS participants agreed that they were satisfied with the course

* Offered two intermediate level courses

- Survey Design with Robert Wong in March (15)
- * After Data Analysis: From Report Writing to Knowledge Translation with Gail Barrington in November (27)
- * Majority of participants found improved understanding, and knowledge/skills learned would be useful in their jobs
