2016-2017 Key Priorities

Networking:

 - * Collaboration with Treasury Board Secretariat, and École nationale d'administration publique

Professional Development:

- * Offered 4 ESS sessions (1 French, 3 English)
- * Workshop on qualitative methods in realist synthesis by Dr. Gil Westhorp
- * Two workshops on data visualization by Dr. Stephanie Evergreen
- * Renewing roster for those providing professional development services for the chapter
- Working with ESDC and Évalue-action to produce emerging evaluator profiles

CES-NCC Activity Report

Accomplishments: Other

- * Completed third and final year of 2014 conference surplus investment
- * Using chapter survey results to inform board's June 2016 strategic planning session
- * Christmas Networking Event (n>40)
- * Entered discussions regarding hosting National Conference 2020

Significant Chapter Survey Findings

- Majority agree that CES-NCC membership provides them with a range of benefits. Also believe that the Chapter could offer more frequent events and more intermediate and advanced offerings
- The single largest challenge faced by Ottawa evaluators to accessing professional development opportunities is the relevance of the topics offered
- Respondents greatly prefer in-person events over webinars and other remote offerings
- Most respondents see value in partnering with other organizations, particularly PPX, for networking or professional development opportunities

- * Offered one intermediate level course
 - Qualitative Methods in Realist Evaluation with Dr.Gil
 Westhorp and Kim Grey in May 2016 (14+ participants)
