* Accept Chapter report on Activities for 2020-21

- * Approve the following Constitutional amendment:
 - * Modify Article VI, section 1 to the following: Regular Elections of Directors shall be held in May of each fiscal year. The Board of Directors may delay Regular Elections once, for 20 days, in the event that an insufficient number of nominations are submitted to fill vacancies. Terms of office cover the period between July 1st and June 30th. Directors are elected for a three (3) year term and onethird of the Directors shall stand for election every year.

- * Approve the following Constitutional amendment:
 - * Add the following clause to the end of Article VI: In the event that the Board of Directors has vacant voting positions and that there are no alternates from previous elections willing to fill remaining vacancies, the Board of Directors may hold byelections. The term of Directors elected through by-elections shall extend until the next Regular Elections. An electronic notice shall be sent to all members to inform them of the upcoming by-elections and the nomination process, at least 30 days before the by-election. Nominations and elections will follow the procedure set out as per Articles 4 to 11.

- * Approve the following Constitutional amendment:
 - * Modify Article XII, section 2 to the following: A quorum of the Board of Directors is four members.
